

ORGANISATION Scheme

The Assembly of Young Internists and the Young Internists members.

The Assembly of Young Internists is made up of national representatives nominated by each of the EFIM member societies. Meetings of the Assembly are held in conjunction with a meeting of the EFIM Administrative Council. The main function of the Assembly of Young Internists is to support the activities of EFIM and the Administrative Council and to act as a link to Young Internist groups within the member countries.

The term 'Young Internist' refers to doctors in training in Internal Medicine and to doctors in the early years of their senior posts. Ideally those taking positions as sub-committee members and national representatives will be involved for a minimum of two years to ensure continuity within the organisation.

Structure of the Young Internists sub-committee

- Administration of the Young Internists' activities is carried out by the Young Internists sub-committee with the approval of the Assembly o Young Internists.
- The sub-committee consists of a Chairperson, a Secretary, a Treasurer and up to four members, all of whom should be of different nationalities.
- The officers of the sub-committee are appointed by the Assembly for a period of two years and may be re-elected for a further term of two
 years.
- The officers will be responsible for preparing the agenda for the meetings of the sub-committee and the Assembly, recording the minutes
 of meetings, managing the budget and reporting back to the EFIM Executive.
- The sub-committee will allocate specific tasks to each of the sub-committee members dependant on the resolutions of the Assembly.

OUR MISSION

Creating a network of Young Internists

By forming a strong network of Internists in training or in the early years of specialisation across Europe, we provide opportunities to cooperate, to exchange ideas and to share experiences. We aim to establish a community of Young Internists that will facilitate communication between individuals and national Young Internists groups, encouraging and supporting trainee representation within Internal Medicine across Europe.

Promoting Internal Medicine

The position of Internal Medicine is constantly evolving, and has in some respect been threatened by the increasing sub-specialisation driven by rapidly expanding knowledge and an array of available treatments. However, the demands of multi-morbid, ageing populations and increasing public expectations are difficult to meet by a fragmented, super-specialised health service, and the Young Internists believe that Internal Medicine can form the core of a modern, fit-for-purpose health service. We aim to provide a forum to explore, discuss and promote this vision of Internal Medicine as an adaptable, holistic and patient-centred specialty.

Participating in administrative processes

The participation of Young Internists in administrative processes within EFIM and at national level will help define the problems related to residency training and working conditions and will bring a fresh perspective to these organisations. A European network of Young Internists will enable the new generation to actively participate in decision-making processes pertinent to the specialty of Internal Medicine, service delivery and training.



A - General Aspects:

- Observe and learn another culture, system of organization and type of relationship with other health professionals and patients.
- Report the main differences between the two countries.
- The internship lasts for a month.
- This is an observational stage.
- Will be issued a certificate of approval credited by the EFIM after sending the final report of both tutor and resident.

B - Requirements to be met by the Hospital

1

• Hospital with appropriate training in Internal Medicine.

2

 Released by the official local organization and bureaucratic compliance with the measures of each participating country.

3

• The tutor should speak English with the resident guest (this rule does not apply if the residents speaks the language of the country that receives).

4

- The clinical visits to patients should be constantly translated by the tutor.
- Clinical cases should be submitted in English.

7

• Provide help and support in finding accommodation.

6

• The final evaluation should be signed by the tutor and should be sent directly to the EFIM.

C - Requirements to be met by the resident:

1

• Must speak fluent English.

2

• Must have completed at least the first two years of medical residency in IM.

3

• Must have health insurance current and valid during the period of stay in the receiving country.

1

• Must have the support of the National Society of Internal Medicine of their country.

7

• Should write a final report.

6

• Should establish prior contact with the tutor in order to obtain information about the equipment for the training period.

7

• The resident must have the same workload of the residents of the specialty of Internal Medicine in the receiving country.

EFIM EXCHANGE PROGRAM

The EFIM Exchange Program is a project which offers supervised internships of one month, to the Internal Medicine European residents, in Internal Medicine Units of different countries of Europe.

The EP is managed by a Central Working Group which consists of five members:

- 1. Pedro Conthe, Spain, Chair,
- 2. Carla Araujo, Portugal.
- 3. Maria Cappellini, Italy.
- 4. Sabine Allard, Belgium (previous committee)
- 5. Ozan Yazici, Turkey. (previous committee).

The general objectives and approach of the programme are:

The EP would be set in motion under the following terms:

- Each National Society will select the residents who, having met the stipulated requirements explained below, wish to have an option to engage in a rotation of some of the offered posts, which will be a maximum of three for the year 2012.
- EFIM will sponsor a maximum of ten grants of 600 Euros each, which could be increased with an additional amount at the discretion of the National Society.
- The application deadline for residents who wish to participate in the programme is: 10th June 2012
- The period of the stage will be from now to 10th October.
